I hope you all had a lovely Easter and ate lots of chocolate after being so good during Lent.

I have been busy in the garden again doing mucky jobs like cleaning my decking and trying to clean the pond - I found lots of frogs a far too much slime – Yuck! Did you get outside and enjoy the sunshine? Are you keeping notes in a diary? I hope so.

Children could then write some sentences about animals or even make a little book about animals with a page on mammals, a page on amphibians etc. You could even add a contents page at the front and a glossary at the back — remember to add page numbers!

I also want to let you know that Oxford Reading Tree is providing free access to their e-reading books. If you could practice reading and spelling the Year 2 tricky words I've attached that would be fantastic.
