The boilers, for obvious reasons, need to move above ground and will take over some of the existing girls' toilets. The toilets will therefore move to where the library is now and the library will move to the other part of the existing toilets. In the meantime we had already planned to refurbish the boys' toilets. It is a huge (and complicated) undertaking and is coming at great cost. Fortunately though as we pay into the Diocese Building Fund we only have to pay 10%. Something to look forward to!
